Perform all aspects of nursing care, which includes completion and instruction of oral exams, dental radiographs, dental scaling and the instruction of students, clinical staff and clinicians. Assist with case management; setup before, assist during, and cleanup after dental procedures, which includes equipment (instrument cleaning and maintenance). Pre and post-surgical care of patients. Ensure all patient charges entered in the Hospital's Information System are complete and accurate. Develop and maintain excellent working relationships including communicating with staff, students, LVTs, veterinarians, and clients in a professional manner at all times. The Cornell University Hospital for Animals provides 24-hour care for animals 365 days of the year. The schedule for this position requires flexibility to insure that adequate patient care and service needs are provided without interruption or exception. business continuity will be expected as time/business need allows. Schedule may include evening, weekend and/or holiday and on-call shifts. What are the qualifications? Associate's degree in Veterinary Technology and NYS licensure required, with at least 1 year experience (preferred). Excellent communication skills and demonstrated ability to apply excellent judgment in making decisions in accordance with organizational policies and procedures.
